

Order of the Regulator No. 2012/01

REQUEST FROM THE ELECTRIC POWER CORPORATION FOR APPROVAL OF A MONTHLY FUEL SURCHARGE

Pursuant to section 20 of the Electricity Act 2010 ('Act'), the Electric Power Corporation has sought approval from the Regulator for changes to tariffs charged for electricity services due to the increase in the cost of fuel involved in the generation of electricity services. The Electric Power Corporation intends to increase its tariff charges per unit of electricity by adding a 25.10% fuel surcharge onto the current tariffs.

The Order sets out the approved changes in tariffs.

Order approving change in tariff per unit of electricity

1. Domestic Consumers

The Electric Power Corporation is permitted to charge the following tariffs –

- **For 1 – 50 units** **86 sene per unit**
- **For 51 units and above** **103 sene per unit**

2. Non Domestic Consumers

The Electric Power Corporation is permitted to charge the following tariffs –

- **For 1 unit and above** **103 sene per unit**

Duration of the Order

This Order will expire on the earlier of –

- (a) the Regulator revoking this Order; or
- (b) the making of a new Order by the Regulator with respect to the tariffs, rates or charges for the provision of electricity services by the Electric Power Corporation.

Ongoing monitoring of electricity tariffs


In accordance with the Regulator's functions under section 6 of the Act, the Regulator shall monitor the tariffs, rates or charges for the provision of electricity services by the Electric Power Corporation.

Effective date of the Order

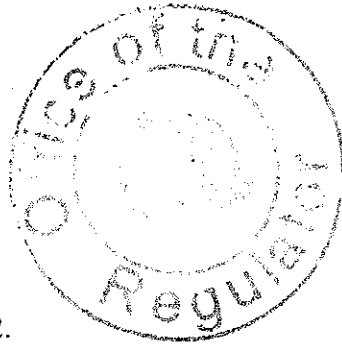
In accordance with section 20(5) of the Act, the Electric Power Corporation shall not charge the abovementioned rates until such time when the Electric Power Corporation has notified consumers of the new tariffs.

The Regulator will allow the Electric Power Corporation **seven (7) days** to notify the public of the change.

This Order is effective from the **6th** day of **April 2012**.
