Order of the Regulator No. 2013/E18

REQUEST FROM THE ELECTRIC POWER CORPORATION FOR APPROVAL OF FUEL SURCHARGE ADJUSTMENT

Pursuant to section 20 of the Electricity Act 2010 ('Act'), the Electric Power Corporation has sought approval from the Regulator to implement retail rates charged to electricity consumers for the provision of electricity services

Order approving change in tariff per unit of electricity

The Order sets out the approved as follows:

1. Domestic Consumers

The Electric Power Corporation is permitted to charge the following tariffs:

- For 1-50 units
- 86 sene per unit
- For 51 units and above 102 sene per unit

2. Non Domestic Consumers

The Electric Power Corporation is permitted to charge the following tariffs:

For 1 unit and above

102 sene per unit

3. Cash Power Consumers

All cash power consumers shall receive a 2% discount on the tariffs specified above. Accordingly, the Electric Power Corporation is permitted to charge the following tariffs:

For domestic cash power consumers:

- For 1 50 units 85 sene per unit
- For 51 units and above 100 sene per unit

For non-domestic cash power consumers:

• 1 unit and above

100 sene per unit

4. Duration of the Order

This Order will expire on the earlier of:

(a) The Regulator revoking this Order; or

(b) The making of a new Order by the Regulator with respect to the tariffs, rates or charges for the provision of electricity services by the Electric Power Corporation

5. Ongoing Monitoring of Electricity Tariffs

In accordance with the Regulator's functions under section 6 of the Act, the Regulator shall monitor the tariffs, rates or charges for the provision of electricity services by the Electric Power Corporation.

6. Effective Date of the Order

In accordance with section 20(5) of the Act, the Electric Power Corporation shall not charge the above mentioned rates until such time when the Electric Power Corporation has notified consumers of the new tariffs through the media and via an insertion of a notice in bills to consumers.

The Regulator will allow the Electric Power Corporation thirty (30) days to notify the public of the change.

The Order is therefore effective from the 7th day of November 2013
