Order of the Regulator

Replacement Interconnection Charges applicable to Digicel (Samoa) Limited and SamoaTel Limited

Pursuant to the authority of the Regulator in section 8(1)(i) and in accordance with section 39A(7) of the Telecommunications Act 2005 as amended (the "Act"), this Order sets out the interim interconnection charges applicable to Digicel (Samoa) Limited and SamoaTel Limited ("the parties").

1. Mobile Terminating Rates:

The parties shall pay to the other nineteen point five sene (\$0.195) for each minute of traffic that is terminated on the other's mobile network.

2. Fixed Terminating Rate:

Digicel (Samoa) Limited shall pay SamoaTel Limited eight point two sene (\$0.082) for each minute of traffic that is terminated on SamoaTel Limited's fixed-line network, where minutes are to be accumulated in increments of 6 seconds.

Outgoing International Calls:

SamoaTel Limited will charge Digicel (Samoa) Limited at a thirty per cent (30%) discount from the lower of the residential or business retail charges in effect at the time of call placement for all international calls originating in Digicel (Samoa) Limited's mobile network.

The timing of calls will be accumulated on a per second basis.

4. Incoming International Calls:

SamoaTel Limited will pay Digicel (Samoa) Limited nineteen point five sene (\$0.195) per minute for all incoming international calls terminating on Digicel (Samoa) Limited's mobile network.

The timing of calls will be accumulated on a per second basis.

5. Short Message System Charges

SMS messages shall be charged at a reciprocal rate of five sene (\$0.05) per SMS.



6. Directory Enquiry Calls

Digicel (Samoa) Limited shall pay SamoaTel Limited twenty-seven sene (\$0.27) for each directory enquiry call.
